Conjugated past tenses are very rare. A relict of the aorist is only seen in archaic Jain Prakrit:

kāsīa did

āsīa was

cintīa thought

dāhīa gave

sāhīa told

- Much more common is the use of the past participle.
- Generally it agrees with the agent if the verb is intransitive and the patient if the verb is transitive.
- In the latter case, the agent can appear in the instrumental case.
- It's better **not** to translate these as passives, because there is no active counterpart.

kaa- done

thia- stood

cintia- thought

dinna- given

sittha- told

dharia- borne

ruṇṇa- wept

# setthissa mayā sittham

I told the merchant.

[lit. "to-the-merchant by-me it-was-told"]

## nīyā ya mayā gharam niyam

I brought them to my house.

### tō tēṇa cakkavāō gahiō

Then he took the *cakravāka* bird.

dițțhā ya tēņa

He saw [me].

tīe kira kayam imam cittam

They say she made this painting.

sahi **siṭṭhaṁ** jaṁ māhavilaāē jaṁ camha tēṇa **sandiṭṭhaṁ** tassa taē aṇusarisaṁ ṇa kiñci **appāhiaṁ** vaaṇaṁ

Līlāvaī 564

My friend, you have not **sent** any message fitting to that which Māhavilaā **told** us, and what he **sent** to us.
